INTRODUCTION

GivHOPE is a Cameroonian Law nonprofit, lay and apolitical social association. **GivHOPE** is regularly registered under the Declaration of creation # 0322/RDA/106/SAAJP/BAPP of March 14, 2016 even though it went operational in September 2014. This Association was created to accompany the Government in its fight against the phenomenon of vulnerable target groups and especially street children in Cameroon, starting with Yaoundé as a pilot project.

OVERALL OBJECTIVE

To fight against the phenomenon of street children in Cameroon and in the sub region of Central Africa jointly with all good wills and active key actors in the domain.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

- Reduce the negative impact of poverty on children's lives in general and street children in particular;
- Fight against stigmatization and ill treatment of street children;
- Encourage their return in family or their reinsertion in the society;
- Reinforce ties and partnership among the different key actors on the protection of children rights;
- Ensure the target groups receive the Word, Jesus, who is True and Live;
- Ensure follow up and post evaluation of the project.
